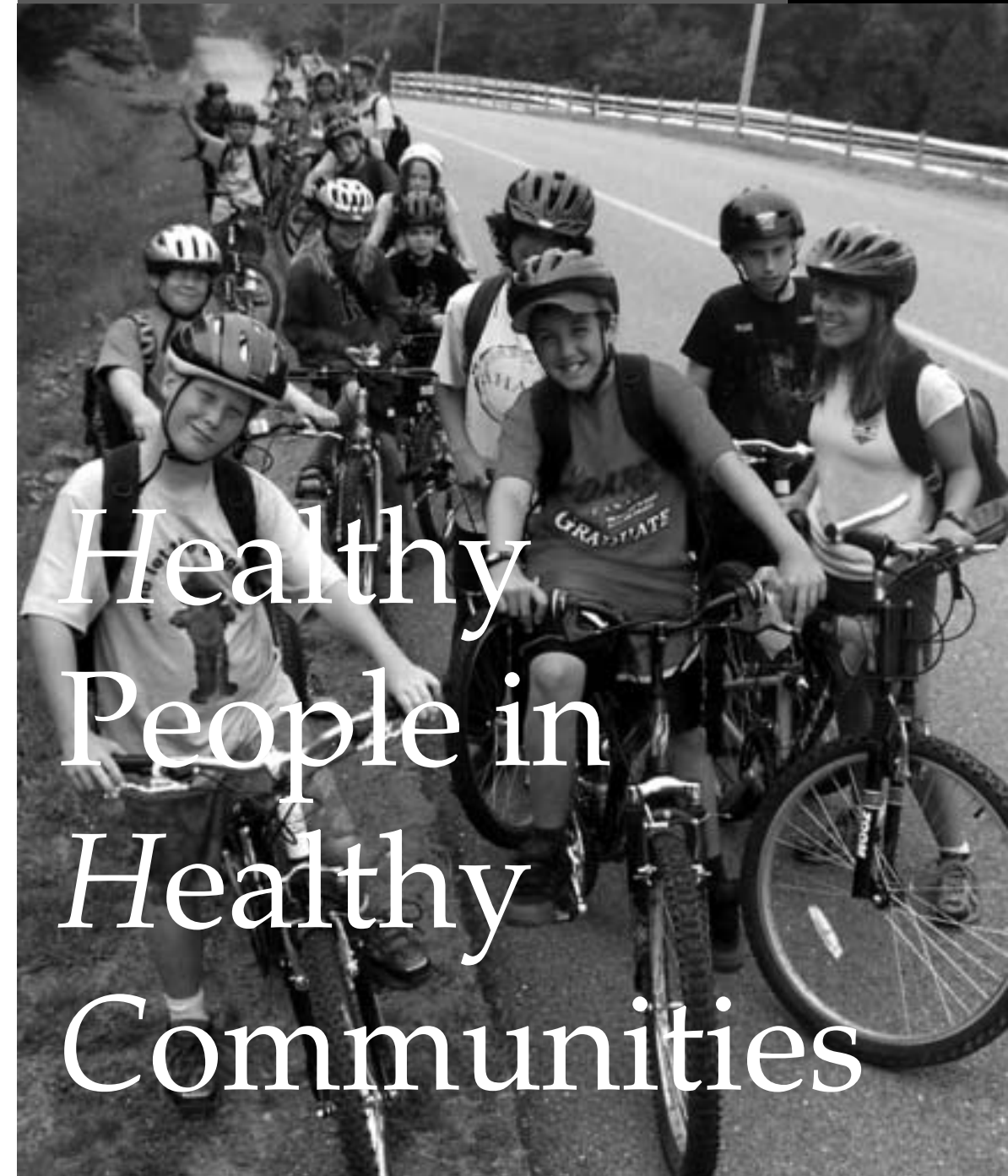

BOARD of HEALTH

The Williamson County & Cities Health District (WCCHD) has been Williamson County's public health agency since 1943. Currently, more than 90 full time, part time, and hourly staff members and 3 consulting physicians serve the 290,355 county residents (1/03 projected by the Texas State Data Center) through offices located in Cedar Park, Georgetown, Round Rock, and Taylor. Through a cooperative agreement among the governing bodies of the previously mentioned four cities and the Williamson County Commissioners' Court, WCCHD was organized as a health district in 1989 (prior to that date we were known as the Williamson County Health Department). These five entities appoint citizen representatives to the Williamson County Board of Health, that has administrative authority and oversees the operation of the Health District. Each city appoints one member and the Commissioners' Court appoints two members to staggered 3-year terms. The WCCHD Director is a non-voting member. The Board of Health is required to meet at least quarterly. Currently, the Board meets every two months. Meetings are open to the public.

The **Environmental Health Services** enforces the On-Site Sewage Facilities (OSSF) regulations in Williamson County. The staff also administers the County's flood plain program. All food establishments are routinely inspected up to four times each year and food handler education classes are provided throughout the county every week.

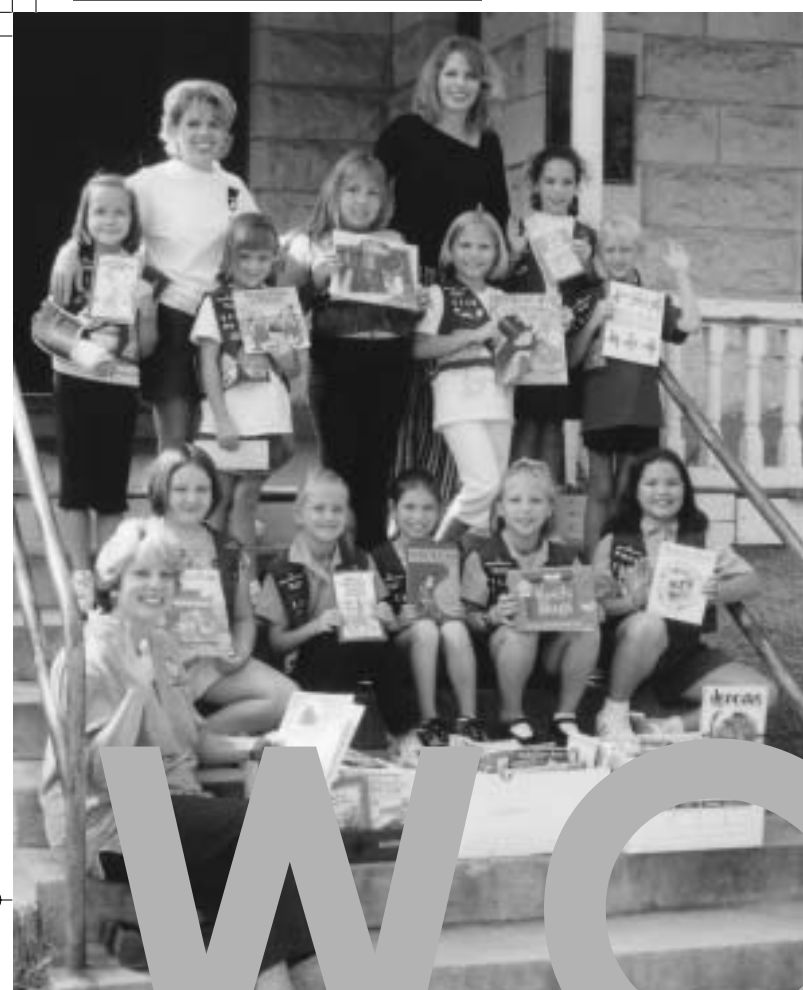

Administrative Services is responsible for the following internal and external services for all WCCHD program areas: accounting, budgeting, financial management and reporting, personnel/payroll, purchasing, and records management. Administrative Services provides support services as needed to implement programs in accordance with grant and contract agreements.

Report to the Community 2003 Funding: Williamson County & Cities Health District funding is derived from contributions from the member governments, Texas Department of Health contracts, client fees, Medicaid and Medicare reimbursement, United Way contributions, and other grants, contracts, and contributions.

The Health District's fiscal year is January-December; the FY 2003 operating budget was \$4,543,305. In addition to funds, Williamson County provides in-kind contributions that include facilities, utilities, janitorial and maintenance services, telephone, payroll processing, and administration of the employee benefits program.

Williamson County & Cities Health District food inspection program does a great job keeping us safe with three full-time and one part-time food inspection crew. Although they have nearly 900 locations to monitor, the supervisor says the department visits most sites four times a year, and every location at least twice a year.

Offering immunizations to prevent communicable disease is a critical public health program. Public Health nurses immunized thousands of Williamson County residents in 2003.

WCCHD's WIC program has a successful record for improving the diet of infants, children, and pregnant, postpartum and breastfeeding women who are at risk for nutrition-related illness. A challenging economic year saw HELPLINE calls at WCCHD increase.

The Children Health Insurance Program was affected by legislative changes, but WCCHD outreach staff rose to the challenge and proved resourceful in building new partnerships and finding innovative ways to encourage families to keep their children insured.
