WIC services include nutritional counseling, prenatal education, breastfeeding support, and food benefits are available to those who qualify.

Clinical services include immunizations, screening of sexually transmitted diseases, testing & treatment of TB and TB infection, and HIV testing & counseling. A parent or legal guardian must accompany minors (under 18 years of age) for immunizations.

Environmental health services include retail food establishment inspections & permitting, food handler training classes, on-site sewage facility permitting, subdivision review, and public health nuisance investigations.

Walk-ins will be served when possible but we can stop taking clients when the maximum number that can be safely served within our hours of operation has been reached.
